Rabun County Baptists Call Associational Missionary

The Rabun County Baptist Association (RCBA) voted, at their quarterly meeting on February 6, to extend a call to Rev. William (Bill) F. Barker to be the Associational Missionary for the 18 Southern Baptist churches and missions of Rabun County.

Rev. Barker has pastored and served churches in Georgia for over 30 years, and for the past 19 years, he has worked nationally with Southern Baptists, directing ministries with the thirteen states of the Appalachian region of our nation, as well as ministries in the Mississippi River region. In these ministries, he coordinated an average of 50,000 mission volunteers each year, who served the people of these regions. He also directed the annual Christmas Backpack ministry,

and each year an average of 70,000 backpacks were filled with gifts, food, clothing, Bibles, and school supplies and delivered to the children in need in these more impoverished areas of our nation.

We can be most effective, as we cooperate as an association of churches", says Barker. "I look forward to working with these wonderful pastors, leaders, and churches here in the county."
